This section regulates, with limited exceptions in instances of undue regulatory burden or unsafe operation, the interconnection of electric utilities with a qualifying cogeneration or small power production facility at reasonable, nondiscriminatory charges.

PURCHASES

This section regulates, with limited exceptions in instances of adverse economic impact, systems which are authorized wheeling, an electric utility to purchase electric power which is not available from a qualifying cogeneration or small power production facility at reasonable, nondiscriminatory rates based on the electric utility's avoided costs.

3 AAC 5-780  
SALES

This section regulates an electric utility to sell electric power, including supplementary power, back-up power, maintenance power, and interruptible power to a qualifying cogeneration or small power production facility at reasonable, nondiscriminatory rates.

3 AAC 50.790  
IMPLEMENTATION

This section requires an electric utility to file, within 60 days of a request for interconnection from a qualifying cogeneration or small power production facility, tariffs or, if appropriate, special contracts setting forth the charges, rates, terms, and conditions for interconnection power, and the terms of sales of electric power with a qualifying facility.

3 AAC 50.800  
DISCONNECTION

This section delineates those hazardous conditions under which an electric utility has the right to disconnect a qualifying cogeneration or small power production facility without notice.

3 AAC 50.810  
DISPUTES

This section provides that disputes which arise under these regulations will be resolved under the procedure contained in the contract in 3 AAC 48.120-3 AAC 48.130.

This Notice of Realty Action involves long term leases on public lands administered by the Bureau of Land Management in Alaska. The leases are intended to authorize construction of facilities of public service facilities along the James Dalton Highway north of the Yukon River. The facilities are to be located on the State of Alaska to public travel as far north as the Dalton Highway, June 1, 1981, and seasonally will close again on September 1, 1981.

The sites examined and found suitable for leasing under provisions of Section 105 of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1920, are at the Yukon Crossing and the Coldfoot Camp areas. The general location of the sites is shown within the areas described as follows:
