

C.R. Lewis Files

State Senator C.R. Lewis of Anchorage has announced that he has officially filed Monday for the Republican nomination to succeed Howard Pollock as Alaska's United States Representative.

"After most careful consideration, I have decided to run for the United States Congress," Lewis told a press reception Sunday evening in Juneau.

"It is absolutely essential for the state and extremely critical for the nation that this lone seat

in Congress be filled by a fiscally responsible and knowledgeable person with the administrative and legislative experience necessary to become immediately effective in Washington."

Lewis is chairman of the la-

bor and management committee, and a member of the judiciary committee of the Alaska Senate.

He and his wife, Pat, are the parents of five children, and another is expected just before the primary election.
