
#### **PUBLIC NOTICE** BY THE DIVISION OF RETIREMENT AND BENEFITS

Applications must be received before 4:30 p.m., May 31, 1985 at DNR's Southeast Region office. Unauthorized cabins for which an application has not been received by the deadline will either be removed or converted to public use cabins by the state.
