Eskimo - Indian Olympics Committee Wants Rats

The World Eskimo Indian Olympics Committee is seeking muskrats for this year's games. The muskrats will be used in a skinning contest during the game, which are scheduled for July 28, 29, and 30 this summer at the University of Alaska's Patty Gymnasium in Fairbanks.

Due to the hunting season on muskrats, the animals can be taken at this time only in the northern regions of the state. Hunters willing to donate animals for the contest are requested to contact Committee Chairman John Heffle in care of the Tundra Times, Box 1287, Fairbanks, Alaska 99701.
