The State of Alaska, Department of Transportation and Public Facilities, Division of Planning and Programming intends to negotiate a contract for the purpose of engaging a qualified consultant to assist in conducting and developing a comprehensive transportation system study of the interior region of Alaska. The primary study goal will be development of a comprehensive multi-modal regional transportation plan that is sensitive to the immediate and long-range transportation needs of the interior region.

The Department proposes that the project be accomplished in three phases as follows:

Phase I
 Transportation inventory and data acquisition; participation in public involvement and development of a procedure to collect, store, retrieve, and periodically update a comprehensive multi-modal regional transportation plan that is sensitive to the immediate and long-range transportation needs of the interior region.

Phase II
 Evaluation of the Phase I data; development of community priorities; identification of transportation needs; projection of transportation demands; forecasting of community and economic development; participation in public involvement.

Phase III
 Identification and evaluation of transportation alternatives; establishment of transportation priorities; and development of an implementation program; and participation in public involvement.

This effort must have potential for incorporation into a comprehensive transportation system study. Studies done in progress to meet this goal include the Western and Arctic Transportation Study; Mat-Su Transportation Study; Prince William Sound Transportation Study; and the Alaska Transportation Study. This study specifically exclude detailed analysis in the area covered by the Fairbanks Metropolitan Area Transportation Study.

The consultant will be expected to assist Department of Transportation and Public Facilities planners in designing the overall work plan of the study, including an effective public involvement program; maximizing use of Alaskan and/or minority contractors and preparation of proposals required to solicit funding participation by federal agencies. Approximately \$300,000.00 is available for this study. The initial goal for completion of the study is July 1982. This goal may be advanced during negotiations for the final contract.

Project Statement of Interest submittals will be rated according to the Department's established policies and procedures. Initial selection of candidate firms will be based on the Project Statement of Interest. Final consultant selection will be based on the Project Statement of Interest and the Project Statement of Interest response to detailed request for Proposal.
