discrimination The Department of Justice has sought to join in a private suit sought to Join in a private sur-charging the University of Alas-ka with discriminating against women student athletes by giving less assistance to its wo-men's basketball team than it

does to the men's team.

Attorney General Benjamin R. Attorney General Benjamin R. Civiletti said a motion to intervene as plaintiff in Payey v. University of Alaska' and a proposed complaint in intervention were filed in U.S. District Court in Appleasa Alaska.

in Anchorage, Alaska.

The suit, filed by three member of the 1978-79 women's team on January 18, 1979, accused the university of denying female athletes equal opportunity to compete in intercollegiate

sports.

The Justice Department's proposed suit said the university is violating the Equal Protection Clause of the Fourteenth A-mendments of 1972, which for-bids sexual discrimination in fed-erally funded educational pro-

grams. The proposed suit asked the court to find the university in violation of the law and Constitution, to enjoin it from continuity. uing its alleged discriminatory practices against female athletes, and to require it to end the al-leged discrimination against

leged discrimination against women's intercollegiate athletics. Assistant Attorney General Drew S. Days, III, head of the Civil Rights Division, said the Justice Department is committed to eliminating sex discrimination in interesting in the committed to th ation in intercollegiate athletics.

The action is the second taken by the Department this week to enforce Title IX.

Because there has been relatively little litigation on these issues,

Mr. Days said it is hoped that the Department's action will help establish much-needed judi-cial interpretations of the nature and scope of Title IX as it ap-plies to intercollegiate sports, and should help obtain volunta-ry compliance. ry compliance.

Mr. Days noted that Title IX provides, "No person in the United States shall on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in the basis of the basis of sex, be excluded from participation." tion in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education pro-gram or activity receiving Fede-ral financial assistance."
