This position will be involved with a analysis of a variety of problems related to State budget priorities. The individual will be responsible for research design, data collection, analysis and report writing on problems specified by the director. Specific problem areas include development of long-range fiscal plans, multi-year budget forecasts, and fiscal impacts of barious developmental and dinancial proposals. Additional tasks include review of economic studies performed by agencies or consultants and review of legislation. The candidate will be expected to effectively communicate research results to decision makers in executive and legislative branches.

Candidates should possess a minimum Master's degree in economics with a Ph.D. preferred. Course emphasis in applied microeconomics, resource economics, econometrics or public finance are desireable as are strong quantitative skills. Relevant experience may be substituted for education.
