

Composers Asked to Submit Music

The National Federation of Music Clubs, represented in Alaska by Jane Stewart, through the offices of Alaska American Revolution Bicentennial Commission, has invited Alaska composers to submit tapes or manuscripts of original works to be considered for performance in the November 1, 1976 Parade of American Music Program in Kennedy Center, Washington, D.C.

Only American composers born in Alaska, now living in Alaska, or who composed while living in Alaska, are eligible to have compositions considered. Dr. Merle Montgomery, President, National Music Council, heads the judging panel.

From works submitted, one or more will be selected for performance or a composer will be commissioned to prepare new work.

Application Forms should be requested from the Alaska Bicentennial Commission, 338 Denali, 840 MacKay Building, Anchorage, Alaska. 99501.

Tapes or manuscripts must be received in that office before August 15. If a new work is commissioned, it must be completed by June 1, 1976.

A grant from EXXON partially funds the Bicentennial Parade of American Music sponsored by National Federation of Music Clubs and the National Music Council.

The concerts are part of the State Day celebration sponsored by the office of the Bicentennial programming of the District of Columbia.
