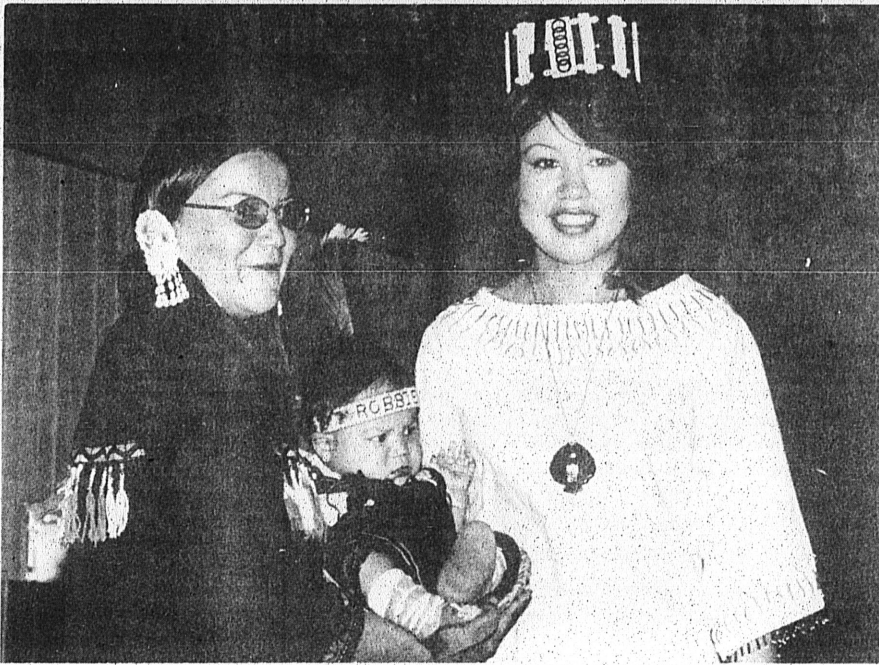


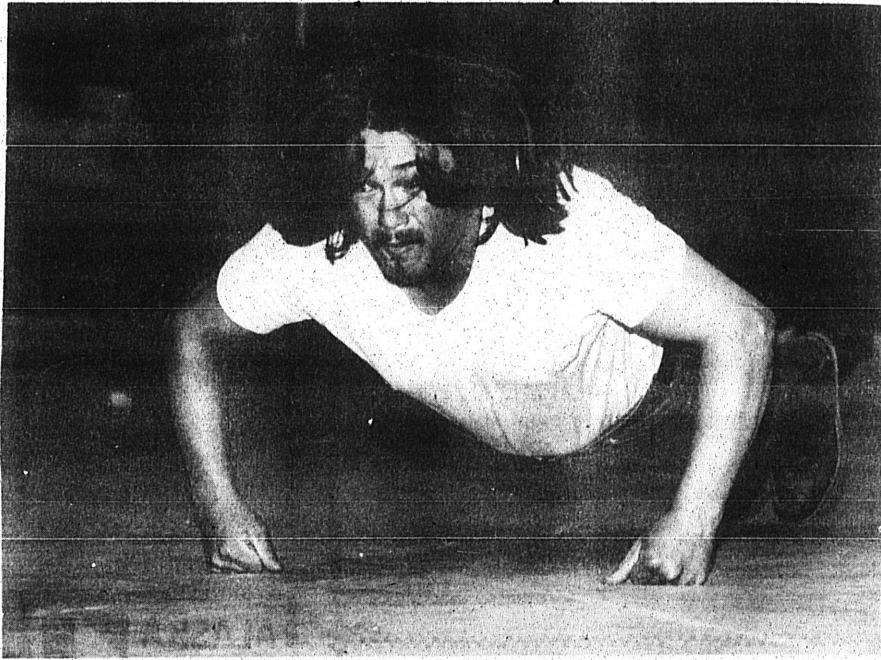
'75 Eskimo-Indian Olympics Events
