

SJC gets gift

Sheldon Jackson College has announced the receipt of two major gifts to the college student scholarship program.

The Grotto Foundation of St. Paul, Minnesota, recently donated \$64,000 to be awarded to students majoring in natural resource management and development.

The Grotto Foundation was established by Mr. Louis W. Hill who has long demonstrated his interest in philanthropic support for undergraduate education in fisheries and forestry.

The second major gift of \$25,000 was received from the Charlotte W. Newcombe Foundation of Princeton, New Jersey. This scholarship money is to be given to students of out-

standing academic potential who demonstrate need for financial assistance.

Sheldon Jackson College president, Dr. Michael E. Kaelke in announcing these gifts indicated that "we are most grateful for these generous gifts. The monies are most important to our scholarship program but more importantly signify the high level of confidence which the Grotto Foundation and Charlotte W. Newcombe Foundation Board of Trustees place in the programs, faculty and students of Sheldon Jackson College."

The total scholarship funds awarded by Sheldon Jackson College for the 1983-84 academic year are \$252,549.
