A team of 28 gold medal winners emerged from Saturday's ARCO Jesse Owens Games at Fairbanks. The regional winners will join 28 winners from Anchorage in national competition in Los Angeles on August 13.

Youngsters who were winners in preliminary meets at Nome and Barrow and Kotzebue joined Fairbanks-area competitors for Saturday's regional meet. On hand to present awards were Wilma Rudolph, 1960 Olympics gold medal winner; Alaska's senior U.S. Sen. Ted Stevens, Fairbanks city mayor Bill Walley, Fairbanks-North Star Borough Mayor Bill Allen and Atlantic Richfield Company executive vice president E.M. (Mo) Benson.

The all-expense-paid trip to Los Angeles next month, courtesy of Atlantic Richfield, will include a day at Disneyland. The national games will take place in Memorial Coliseum, home of the 1984 Olympic Games.
