NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE COMMERCIAL FISHERIES ENTRY COMMISSION

Notice is given that the Alaska Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission, under authority vested by AS 16.43.010 and following, proposes to adopt, amend, and repeal regulations in Title 20, Chapter 05 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement the provisions of AS 16.43.100 and AS 16.43.170 as follows:

1. Revision of the schedule of annual fees for all fisheries.
2. Repeal of paragraph 20 AAC 05.240(c)(1), which related only to application renewal fees for 1985.
3. Amendment to paragraph 20 AAC 05.240(c)(2), to delete a reference to 1986 which is no longer necessary.
4. Repeal of subsection 20 AAC 05.425(b) thereby disallowing renewal of an inter-lake permit for two-year periods.
5. Repeal of subsection 20 AAC 05.580(i) thereby disallowing renewal of an entry permit for two-year periods.
6. Establishment of a procedure whereby a permit holder may keep a notice of intent to transfer an entry permit continuously on file with the Commission without requiring a 60-day period for each additional filing after the first.
7. Amendment of subsection 20 AAC 05.750(a) to provide for those taking permits by survivorship or right of inheritance to receive the permit when they intend to immediately assume the fishing operation.
8. Amendment to subsection 20 AAC 05.750(f) to clarify the intent of the regulation to allow emergency transfers by those taking permits by survivorship or right of inheritance.
9. Establishment of a user fee for certain services provided at Commission field offices.
10. Establishment of a policy regarding personal checks which are dishonored.
