## **Elderly Tenants**

Senator Clifford P. Case (R-N.J.) said he sees the chances for lifting the four unit or less exemption on apartment houses improving as the plight elderly tenants becomes more widely known.

Currently, small aparuments units are exempt from all economic controls. Senator Case nomic controls. Senator Case reports to the Cost of Living Council that elderly citizens in small apartment anticipate increases averaging between \$25 creases averaging between \$2.3 and \$30 per month in the light of the 20 per cent increase in Social Security benefits. Senator Case has called on the Cost of Living Council to

reimpose economic controls on small apartments and make the President's "Rent Watch" for senior citizens a success.

Since then support for Sena-tor Case's position has increased, the Internal Revenue Service has Case's assertion, and a leading Washington newspaper (the Star-News) editorially has backed removing the exemption.



Dr. Doyle, who is currently on sabbatical from the university, will include a pilot study and preliminary data collected in her research in community psychology.

Dr. Doyle also will particpate in a workshop for psychothera-pasits at Sarasota, Florida, Oct. 29 through Nov. 4. The psychotherapists will share innovative applications in group process.

Dr. Doyle will present a session of spontaneous poetry reading from a creativity work-shop she conducted at Homer shop she last July.
