

## McG Indian Policy

WASHINGTON, D.C. — (AIPA) — A policy statement on American Indians has been released by Democratic presidential candidate Sen. George McGovern of South Dakota. The full text, released by the McGovern campaign headquarters here Oct. 13, is as follows:

"The American people have become more keenly aware of the problems and issues facing the American Indians and the legal and moral obligations of the United States toward these people growing out of the historic trust relationship - a trust which has been largely unfulfilled and strewn with promises unkept. As President, I would not and could not continue this neglect and deceit.

"The future of the Indian tribes and the development of a federal Indian policy must be centered on the integrity of the tribal entity and the basic right of the Indian people to self-government. I am firmly committed to the maintenance of tribal self-government and those policies and programs which will add authority and strength to tribal government.

"With this as the foundation of my Indian policy, I will direct appropriate officials of my administration to take immediate steps to review and evaluate the impact of the Indian 'Bill of Rights' provisions of the 1968 Civil Rights Act and to make recommendations for revisions needed in this law to strengthen and preserve tribal sovereignty and self-government while protecting the basic human liberties of tribal members.

"As applied by the federal courts, the Indian 'Bill of Rights' law demeans and destroys tribal sovereignty and self-government. We are replacing bureaucratic 'colonialism' on the reservations with judicial 'colonialism.'

"Franklin Roosevelt's policy of the restoration of Indian self-government and sovereignty through the Wheeler-Howard Act - largely ignored and frustrated by the Nixon administration - must be continued and expanded."

- \$1,000,000 for repairs, replacements and upgrading of utilities and ceilings in residence halls, Bunnell Building and Parly Gym.
- \$2,500,000 for 30,000 sq. ft. Phase II of Arctic Biology Building.
- \$1,000,000 for student housing apartment complex.
- \$350,000 — Northwest Community College (Extension Center) at Nome General purpose instructional and headquarters building.
