NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE COMMERCIAL FISHERIES ENTRY COMMISSION

Notice is hereby given that the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission under authority vested by AS 16.43.100 and AS 16.43.110, proposes to adopt and amend regulations in Title 29 of the Alaska Administrative Code to provide as follows:

20 AAC 05. is amended by adding new sections to read:

20 AAC 05.571. APPLICATION FOR SPECIAL HARVEST AREA ENTRY PERMITS.

(a) Application for Special Harvest Area Entry Permits shall be made on forms as required by the commis-

sion and shall be accompanied by a written statement from the Department of Fish and Game acknowledging that the applicant is the holder of a private, non-profit hatchery permit issued under AS 16.10.400-475 and specifying the Special Harvest Area for which the permit is to be issued.

(b) Permits issued under AS 16.43.335 through 341, inclusive, shall expire on midnight December 31, of the year of issuance.

20 AAC 05.572. SPECIAL HARVEST AREA GEAR OPERATORS.

(a) Only persons designated as agents by holders of Special Harvest Area Entry Permits may operate gear under the permit. Designation shall be made on forms provided by the Commission.

(b) Each Special Harvest Area gear operator must have on his possession a copy of the completed designation of agent form and a valid Special Harvest Area Entry Permit card while operating gear or in possession of fish as required by sections 100 and 110 of this chapter.

20 AAC 05.650 is amended by adding new subsections (e), (f), (g) and (h):

20 AAC 05.650. SPECIAL RULES FOR USE OF THE POINT SYSTEM.

(e) An applicant who has applied for two or more entry permits under AS 16.43.260(d) for the same specific fishery resource and the same specific type of gear may credit his cumulative qualifications to the fishery for which he is most qualified if he has failed to qualify for an entry permit for that type of fishery resource and gear.

(f) An applicant who qualifies under subsection (e) of this section shall be issued a permit if the applicant's cumulative qualifications equal or exceed 20 points. For purposes of determining the point level the following applies:

(1) duplicate points will not be awarded under 20 AAC 05.630 (b) (3) or (4);

(2) duplicate points for participation on any one year under 20 AAC 05.630 (a) will not be awarded.

(g) For purposes of this section, an applicant is defined as a person who was eligible to apply and did apply in a timely manner in accordance with AS 16.43.260 and section 510 of this chapter.

(h) Those individuals who may qualify under subsection (e), (f), and (g) are required to notify the Commission of their potential qualification.

Notice is given that any interested person may present oral or written statements or arguments relevant to the action proposed at a hearing to be held at Juneau, Alaska in the 5th Floor Conference Room of the State Office Building on October 19, 1979, at 10:00 am.

Notice is also given that any person interested may present written statements or arguments relevant to the proposed change, by writing to the address indicated below, before 12:00 pm on October 31, 1979.
