

42 Enroll for Nome Vocational Training

On October 18, twenty clerk typists and 22 building maintenance trainees representing 12 Alaskan communities answered the roll. The number of trainees and courses will increase progressively during the winter.

By the time school closes next spring some 200 persons will have had occupational training.

The Nome program is operated by the State of Alaska through federal Manpower Development and Training funds. The State Department of Education provides the training while the Alaska Department of Labor administers trainee recruitment, allowance payments and job followup.
