

UAF expects 3 from Greenland to enroll this year

FAIRBANKS — Three students from Greenland are expected to enroll at the University of Alaska Fairbanks this spring under the terms of an agreement signed this fall by UAF Chancellor Patrick O'Rourke and the Ministry of Culture, Education and Labor Market in Greenland, according to UAF.

The agreement allows undergraduate students from Greenland to be accepted for admission at UAF as if they were Alaskan students and to study at UAF at in-state tuition levels. The Greenlandic students will be included in the programs and activities UAF provides for international students. A condition for admission is passing a language competency class.

The Greenlandic ministry will be responsible for the educational costs of the students, which will include tuition, room, board, books, health insurance and the other costs of a four-year university education.
