

School Land

The Bureau of Indian Affairs has requested withdrawal of two tracts of land totaling 4.035 acres for school facilities at Tuntutuliak, Alaska, Burton W. Silcock, Alaska State Director of the Bureau of Land Management announced.

Withdrawal of the land from all forms of appropriation under the public land laws was requested.

The BIA desires the land as a site for auxiliary facilities to the existing school plant, including the relocation and completion of a sewage treatment plant.

This project will prevent the pollution of the small stream which flows through the village. The sewage disposal facility is needed to remove a health hazard existing in the community and construction is planned for this season.

Tuntutuliak is a Native trustee townsite of approximately 145 inhabitants located about 50 miles southwest of Bethel near the west shore of Kuskokwim Bay.
