

AHFC sells \$10 million short-term notes

Alaska Housing Finance Corporation recently sold \$10 million in short-term mortgage purchase program notes at an annual rate of 4.24%. Alaska Housing Finance Corporation provides money for mortgage loans to Alaskan homebuyers. The \$10 million will be used to purchase Alaskan mort-

gages and the payments from these mortgages will in turn be used as collateral to repay the long-term bonds that the corporation will buy in the near future. The corporation had recently been assigned a top rating of "MIG 1" from Moody's, the national rating agency.

Langhorne A. Motley, commissioner of Commerce and Economic Development, and a member of the corporation's board of directors, said the rating "reflects the fiscal responsibility of the corporation and its new and unique method of obtaining conventional financing for Alaska housing."

SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE 76-7
AN ORDINANCE
APPROPRIATING MONEY OUT OF THE TREASURY FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1977.

The ordinance is a non-code ordinance. There is appropriated from the treasury a total of \$2,271,400.00, consisting of appropriations for: General Government operating expenditures in the total sum of \$10,835,400 the source of funds for which is the general fund of the borough and an appropriation to the school board operating budget of the amount of \$9,454,900.00, the total sum of which is derived from the State Foundation Program, other state and federal aid and local taxes.

There is appropriation made for capital improvements consisting of a down payment for capital projects, communication services, school construction, and local services roads and trails in the sum of \$6,981,000.00 the source of which is from the general fund of the borough, and state aid.

The ordinance has provision for adjustment if non-local revenues vary from estimates, provisions for appropriation of other receipts not estimated in the budget, and for ordering supplies prior to the beginning of the fiscal year, provision for overexpenditure, lapse of balances, and financial reports. The ordinance provides for the due date of taxes as set forth in Title 3.28.250 of the North Slope Borough code. The effective date of the ordinance is upon adoption.
