Association which has recently been incorporated and a Tuesday night recreation night for children.

Also, the residents seek a community hall, so they will not have to trek the mile and a half to town to use the facilities available.

1. Payment for our land in proportion to its present value.
2. Protection of our land from industrial development, waste and degradation.
3. Programs for our people that insure economic development and dignity.
4. Insurance that oil spills and industrial development in our fragile tundra will be minimal and that there will be monetary reimbursement to our people should they occur.

The only way we Eskimos can help ourselves to insure this program is by hiring attorneys and lobbyists to represent us to Congress, to the State of Alaska and to the oil companies.
