\$71 Million Military Construction

"The Department of Defense has asked the Senate Appropriations Committee for a total of more than \$11 million for military construction in the State of Alaska," said Senator Ted Stevens, a member of the Appropriations Subcommittee for Military Construction.

If approved, the Army will receive nearly \$2 million for Alaska, including Fort Richardson.

The Navy Budget requests \$4.3 million for construction at Adak and the Arctic Research Laboratory at Point Barrow.

Eielson Air Force Base, at Fairbanks; Indian Mountain Air Force Station; and Shemya Air Force Base will receive nearly \$5 million in construction funds.

Two new family housing units will be built for the National Guard at Bethel and two at Nome.

Stevens said, "The Department of Defense has included more than \$14 million in its Alaska construction budget for pollution control: \$7.7 million for air pollution and \$6.4 million for water pollution abatement.

"Fort Wainwright will receive \$3.5 million for the air pollution abatement and \$246,000 for water pollution control."

American Indian Civil Rights Handbook

The United States Commission on Civil Rights is pleased to announce its most recent clearinghouse publication, American Indian Civil Rights Handbook.

Prepared at the suggestion of, and under consultation with Indian organizations and individuals throughout the country, this publication is in response to the familiar complaint that American Indians have never been adequately informed of their rights under Federal law.

The Handbook is addressed to reservation and off reservation Indians throughout the country and discusses the civil rights and civil liberties Native Americans share with other American citizens under the Constitution as well as the specially enacted rights of reservation residents under the 1968 Indian Bill of Rights.

Among the topics covered are the freedoms of speech, press, assembly and religion; due process of law and the rights of criminal defendants; where and how to obtain a lawyer (in this regard the Handbook contains an extensive list of legal services and legal aid programs of special importance to Indians throughout the country); equal protection of the law—freedom from discrimination in Federal programs, employment, education and voting.

The Handbook places special emphasis on remedies for civil rights violations — how and where to file complaints and how to prepare a habeas corpus application.

Although the material discussed is of a legal and highly complex nature, every effort has been made to present it in a readable, nontechnical fashion. Currently under preparation is a brief pamphlet, based upon the Handbook addressed to those who lack the reading skills to benefit from the Handbook.
