NOTICE OF UTILITY CONTRACT FILING

The ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION hereby gives notice that ALASCOM, Inc.
(Alascom), a long lines telecommunications utility, has filed a contract which has been designated
as TAZ70-88. The proposed contract is between Alascom and AT&T to provide FTS2000 ser-
vice. The filing with the Commission is limited to the intrastate aspects of FTS2000. Alascom
requests that both the contract and the cost support submitted with the filing be accorded pro-
prietary status and that the Commission approve the filing on April 13, 1990.

Alascom states that FTS2000 is a combination of telecommunications services being acquired
by the General Services Agency of the federal government. Alascom states that the services
it has agreed to provide include intrastate message telephone service, intrastate private line
service and interstate private line service. Alascom states that revenues under FTS2000 will
exceed those it currently earns under the FTS contract. The terms of the initial contract is three
years subject to renewal.

If after the Commission finds a rate of classification different from that proposed by Alascom
is reasonable, the Commission may approve a rate or classification which varies from that filed.

of the Alaska Public Utilities Commission. The Commission's current address is 1018 West

Any interested person may file a statement of views favoring or opposing this tariff filing
with the Alaska Public Utilities Commission. While comments will be considered by the Com-
mission in determining the appropriate action to be taken, they will not serve to make the per-
son a party to the proceeding. Any person wishing to become a party must file a petition to
intervene in accordance with 5 AAC 48.110 of the Alaska Administrative Code.

To assure Commission consideration of comments or petitions prior to a final decision on
this matter, they must be filed by May 11, 1990. Any comments filed with the Commission should
clearly affirm that the interested person has filed a true copy of the statement with Alascom.

REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
MILITARY AND VETERANS AFFAIRS

NOTICE is given that the Department of Military
and Veterans Affairs, under authority of AS
26.10.010 proposes to adopt regulations in Title
10 of the Alaska Administrative Code (AAC), deal-
ing with the reimbursement of veteran's service
organizations for the employment of service of-
ficers, AS 26.10.040 - AS 26.10.050, as follows:

The proposed regulations add a new
Chapter 10 to Title 10 of the ACC relating
to the reimbursement of veteran's service
organization for the employment of ser-
vice officers. The proposed regulations
provide for reimbursement to be ac-
complished through grants. The proposed
regulations provide for a competitive
process in which interested organizations
will submit written proposals and make
oral presentations to a grant awards ad-
visory board. The board will evaluate the
written proposals and the oral presen-
tations and will make recommendations to
the Director, Division of Veterans Affairs,
as to the amount of money to be granted.
The final decision will be made by the
Director. An appeal procedure is provid-
ed by the proposed regulations. The pro-
posed regulations limit reimbursement to
organizations chartered by the Congress
of the United States. The proposed
regulations require organizations to ac-
count for expenditure of money received
for reimbursement.
