

Fort Yukon Community Facility Gets \$22,604 Fund Increase

An increase of \$22,604 in federal funds for a Fort Yukon community facility for low income residents was announced today by Senator Ted Stevens. The grant from the Department of Housing and Urban Development was raised from \$294,660 to \$317,264.

It is to finance a center to provide services to persons in

Ft. Yukon and surrounding villages. The services include a TB Clinic X-Ray testing, adult recreation.

Administrating the program is Ft. Yukon city executor Tom Tull. The grant increase goes to the city.
