Captained by the famous seafarer, the late Capt.
S. T. L. Whitlam, the North Star cleaved through the Arctic waters which were choked with ice most of the time.

Back in 1937, while maneuvering through ice off Barrow, the old ship's propellors struck ice and bent the blades. The moment the impact was made, she began to vibrate from stem to stern.

From her normal curising speed of 12 knots per hour, the speed was reduced to six or seven knots. Any attempt to increase the speed from that point created violent vibration.

The old ship limped back to Seattle all the way from Barrow at reduced speed. By
