"There will probably be legislation introduced in the State Legislature to cut many services we are now receiving both from State and Federal government," said Charlie. "I will strongly

and vigorously oppose any action that will jeopardize the Native people, not only in my region but Alaska as a whole."
"I can see in the future," he added, "a backlash toward all Alaskan Natives as soon as monies are appropriated to their respective regions."


This grant will be used to develop a family health center which will serve the Fairview area of Anchorage, Alaska.


