This project will consist of grading drainage, and hot asphalt pavement on 6.6 miles of 4-lane divided expressway at Juneau, Alaska.


Principal items of work consist of the following 192,500 cubic yards of Unclassified Excavation; 2,071,000 cubic yards of Borrow; 113,600 tons of Subbase and 128,500 tons of Base; 32,500 tons of Hot Asphalt Pavement 149,000 tons of Riprap; 1,000 linear feet of 12" - 10" x 8" - 4" structural plate Pipe Arch and 452 linear feet 13" - 10" x 11" - 7" structural plate Pipe Arch; 4,100 linear feet of asbestos bonded bituminous coated Steel Pipe Arch ranging in size from 43" x 27" to 72" x 44" inclusive; 5,600 linear feet of Pipe Conduit ranging in size from 12" diameter to 48" diameter; 4,600 linear feet of 8" perforated pipe Underdrain; 25,700 linear feet of Guard Rail; 22,700 linear feet of 6' chain link Fence and 1,700 linear feet of 4' chain link Fence; 1,600 linear feet of type 2 Curb and Gutter; 7,600 linear feet of 15" and 18" Gutter; 60,000 tons of filter Course; 2,415 M.S.F. of Hydro-seeding; 7,000 linear feet of 10" and 20" gravity Sewer Conduit; Highway Lighting, Lump Sum, all required; numerous Telephone and electrical items of work; 1,900 cubic yards of Class A Concrete, lump sum, all required; 50 prestressed concrete Structural Members; 5,400 linear feet of cast in place Concrete Piles; 1,200 linear feet of Metal Bridge Railing; 26,200 pounds of Reinforcing Steel; and miscellaneous items of work.

Government William A. Egan said today.

State employment of Alaska natives as of March totaled 1,049 and of black people 238, according to the commission's figures, Egan said.

The totals as of March a year ago, although records were not as complete at that time, were 442 natives and 56 blacks.

Employment of people of Oriental descent increased from 34 to 59 and of Spanish speaking people and other minority group members from 21 to 32.

The Human Rights Commission, an agency of the governor's office, reported total state employment at 9,305.

"Increasing the employment of minority group members has been and continues to be a top priority of my administration," the governor said, "and I am greatly pleased with the results reported by the commission."

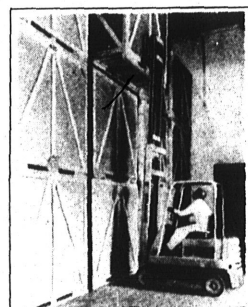

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State Honors Jeffrey

JUNEAU — Governor William A. Egan presented the State's award for heroism and bravery to 13-year old Jeffrey Stone of Fairbanks in recognition of a "valorous and heroic deed performed in the saving of two lives in a fire at Fairbanks on January 20, 1972."

Stone, the son of S. Sgt. and Mrs. Jennie Stone, saved the lives of two youngsters in a burning apartment at Ft. Wainwright.

In a ceremony in the Governor's Office, Governor Egan presented young Stone with the coveted State Medal for Heroism and Bravery and a certificate describing the act of courage.

The citation read: "Thirteen-year old Jeffrey Stone, having observed intense smoke from an apartment building, reacted to the danger signal by attempting to force the door and enter the premises. Finding the door locked, he broke the glass over the door handle with his fist and forced his way into the burning

quarters. The smoke and heat were intense. Two small children, ages three and four, huddled in the dining room area. Jeffrey Stone took both children outside to safety and asked them if there was anyone else in the building. Upon being told that an infant child was upstairs, he made several valiant attempts to reach the bedroom. However, the fire, heat and smoke were so extreme that his ability to breathe was severely impaired. After several attempts to rescue the third child, he was forced to retreat from the inferno. For saving the lives of 2 children, for his great courage in the face of a raging fire, and for his unselfish action at the risk of his own life to save others, the State of Alaska presents its State Medal for Bravery and Heroism to Jeffrey Stone."

Stone was accompanied by his parents at the ceremonies in Juneau.

Principal items of work consist of the following: the project consists of four alternatives, Alternative "A", Nulato to the Airport; 4.4 acres of Clearing and Grubbing; 14,000 cubic yards of Unclassified Excavation; 11,700 cubic yards of Selected Material; 2,600 cubic yards of Subbase; 66,000 square feet of seeding; 1,686 sacks of slope protection; and miscellaneous items of work. Including the airstrip under Alternative "A", Unclassified Excavation increase to 55,000 cubic yards, Subbase increases to 11,000 cubic yards and seeding increases to 283,000 square feet. These quantities make up Alternative "B". Alternative "C" includes only Alternative "A" plus the Koyukuk access quantities. The selected material item increases to 14,900 cubic yards. Under Alternative "D" all three portions are combined.

All work shall be completed in 120 Calendar days.

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
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
