Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials, and equipment, and performing all work on Project F-062-4 (27) and F-037-1 (27), Giliam-Gaffney-Big Bend, described herein, will be received until 2:00 p. m. prevailing time, June 3, 1971 in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project will consist of drainage, and hot bituminous pavement on 2.1 miles of 4-lane divided highway in and adjacent to the city of Fairbanks, Alaska.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 34 acres of Clearing and Grubbing; 341,000 cubic yards of Unclassified Excavation; 806,000 tons of Borrow; 37,000 tons of crushed base; 59,000 tons of Subbase; 15,700 tons of Hot Bituminous Pavement; 940 tons of 120 150 A. C. 37 tons of MC-30 for Prime; approximately 3,400 linear feet of Pine Conduit, 12" diameter to 60" diameter inclusive; approximately 5,400 linear feet of Wood Stake Pipe, 4" diameter to 24" diameter inclusive; 5,800 linear feet of 6" Chain Link Fence; 4,400 Square yards of Concrete Sidewalks; 24,000 linear feet of Concrete Curb and Gutter; 1,000 linear feet of 8" and 12" diameter Steel Water Pipe; complete highway illumination and Traffic Signal System, lump sum, all required; and miscellaneous items of work.
