This project will consist of roadside beautification along 0.98 miles of the Spenard Thruway, in Anchorage, Alaska.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 906,000 square feet of Class 2 and Class 3 Hydro-seeding; 3,000 M. Gal. of Water for Maintenance; 906,000 square feet of Binder Mulch and 906,000 square feet of Topsoil; 90 Trees, 36 Shrubs, and approximately 19,670 plants for Ground Cover. Establishment of vegetative cover shall extend through the 1972 growing season.

Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials, and equipment, and performing all work on Project S-0580 (10), Palmer-Fishhook, Paving, described herein, will be received until 2:00 p.m. prevailing time, May 13, 1971 in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

The project will consist of reconditioning and hot bituminous pavement on 6.9 miles of existing highway, located near Palmer, Alaska. Principal items of work consist of the following: 49,000 tons of Crushed Aggregate Base; 372 stations of Reconditioning; 12,300 tons of Hot Bituminous Pavement; 694 tons of 120-150 Penetration Asphalt; 108 tons of MC-30 Liquid Asphalt; 46 tons of Cationic Emulsion; 400 delinators; 1,856,000 square feet of Hydro-seeding; and miscellaneous items of work.
