The film, "Black Coal, Red
Power," is created by Shelly and
Mary Louise Grossman, a husband and wife writing team who have produced other programs on ecology for public television. In this 90-minute special pro-

gram the Grossmans argue that strip mining and related power plants under construction by the Peabody Coal Company in an area called Black Mesa are severely hurting the natural economy of the Indians by destroying the ecological balance.
