

Better **Bush Mail:** Gravel

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Senator Mike Gravel has urged the U.S. Postal Service to study its mail service in Alaska with an eye toward improving it as changes in bush air routes are being considered.

The Alaska Democrat, in a letter to Postmaster General Elmer T. Klassen, said the greatest number of complaints about mail service in Alaska have come from the rural areas that are served principally by scheduled bush route aircraft.

The Postal Service also told Senator Gravel it is arguing for continuation of mail service by Alaska Airlines and Wien Consolidated Airlines at bush points and for continuation of the rule that allowed certificated air carriers to serve any point within 25 miles of their certificated routes without the need for obtaining additional from the CAB. permission
