Better Bush Mail: Gravel

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Senator Mike Gravel has urged the U.S. Postal Service to study its mail service in Alaska with an eye toward improving it as changes in bush air routes are being considered.

The Alaska Democrat, in a letter to Postmaster General Elmer T. Klassen, said the greatest number of complaints about mail service in Alaska have come from the rural areas that are served principally by scheduled bush route aircraft.

Senator Gravel noted that Alaskan bush routes are now being studied by the Civil Aeronautics Board.

And he added, "Although I have no indication as to the forthcoming decision of the Board, I believe that the new structure presents an excellent opportunity for the Post Office to assess mail delivery throughout Alaska.

"Therefore, I urge you to seriously consider a study of the mail service throughout Alaska at this time with an eye toward improving service."

In a reply, the Postal Service agreed to study bush mail service in line with the forthcoming CAB decision and to determine what changes will be needed in mail transportation patterns in Alaska.

The Postal Service also told Senator Gravel it is arguing for continuation of mail service by Alaska Airlines and Wien Consolidated Airlines at bush points and for continuation of the rule that allowed certificated air carriers to serve any point within 25 miles of their certificated routes without the need for obtaining additional permission from the CAB.

AFN Seattle Chapter Picks Frank Price

It was with much regret that the Board of Directors of the Alaska Federation of Natives, Washington Chapter, accepted the resignation of recently elected President Mr. George Walters.

Mr. Walters has accepted an appointment as Assistant Enrollment Coordinator who will handle the enrollment of Non-resident Alaska Natives, Eskimo, Aleut and Indians of one-quarter degree blood or more and now residing in the "Lower 49".

1st Vice President, Mr. Frank W. Price, Jr., was installed as President and sworn in at the Board meeting of Saturday, April 29th held at the Dart Inn, 330 Westlake Avenue.

Mr. Price has served the Native Community as president of the Alaska Native Brotherhood, Seattle Camp No. 36 and as a Board member of the Tlingit and Haida Indians of Alaska, Washington Chapter for a number of years.

Mr. Price has also been closely involved in the Economic Development aspects of the Native Community in serving with the Northwest Indian Economic Development Association of Seattle since its inception about two years ago.

In parting, Mr. Price said, "George Walters is not leaving us, he is just taking another step forward and will continue to serve his people effectively in his new position as Enrollment Coordinator."
