Civil Service Announces Summer Jobs

The Civil Service Commission has issued a nation-wide summer employment announcement that covers positions in Alaska. These positions are mainly clerical and related office work including stenographers and typists and subprofessional or subtechnical positions such as engineering aids and laboratory aids.

The grade levels are GS-1 through GS-4 and PFS-5 (Post Office Clerk-Carrier).

A written test is required. The test will take about 1½ hours and it will measure vocabulary, reading comprehension, abstract reasoning, and table and chart interpretation.

To apply for summer positions, applicants must submit either the application card form 5000AB or the tear-out application form in the Announcement Number 414.

Either form may be obtained from most Post Offices and from the offices of the Alaska Interagency Board of U.S. Civil Service Examiners in Anchorage or Fairbanks.

The applications must be mailed no later than January 30, 1969, to:

Applications received by January 3, 1969, January 30, 1969, will be scheduled for the written test on February 8, 1969, and March 8, 1969.

Not 3 Bullets Removed But Only Part of One

Dr. Ralph B. Williams, Chief, Branch of Laboratories, Alaska Division of Public Health, who has carried five bullets in his head since last May 13, was released from a California Hospital Dec. 12. Williams reported Monday (Dec. 16) by telephone to his Alaskan office.

Since the May attack when hoodlums fired five bullets into

Williams' head, the doughty doctor has actively pursued his work for several months with the Alaska Division of Public Health.

It had been incorrectly reported that three of the five bullets had been removed after Williams had telephoned his daughter, Mrs. Alan Johnson, Seattle, Washington, followed by another telephone conversation between Mrs. Johnson and her mother, Dr. Williams' wife.

Somewhere there was a misunderstanding leading the daughter and mother to erroneously believe that three bullets which had been frequently discussed by the family had been removed. Actually only one bullet fragment was removed, Dr. Williams said in a telephone message Monday Dec. 16, (1968).
