The resident located on 300 First Avenue is valued at \$33,950 with something more than \$19,000 still to be paid.

The house was inundated during the recent flood and the damage has been set at \$5,000. The owners of the resident did not wish to carry the cost of repair and asked if the Boy Scout organization here would buy the home.

The house did not suffer structural damage from the flood and the oil furnace has been repaired with new parts and is now working.

The property is on a 50 by 80-foot lot. The home has apartments as well as a small house. Income from these is \$665 per month and the monthly payments amount to \$251.
