# Alaska Leads Nation in Venereal Diseases

Alaska leads the nation in reported gonorrhea case-rate, with 888 cases reported per

100,000 population, according to Frederick McGinnis, Commissioner of Health & Welfare.

In the first six months of 1970, the number of reported cases of gonorrhea constituted over 4% of the young-adult pop-

ulation aged 20 to 24.

Since it is estimated that only one case in nine is reported, the true incidence may be as high as 36%.

The number of cases of infectious syphilis in Alaska has also jumped precipitously, said the Commissioner. During the first five months of 1971 there were 29 cases, nearly six times as many as in the equivalent period last year.

Untreated syphilis may cause permanent disability or insanity, while untreated or inadequately treated gonorrhea may lead to sterility, arthritis, or blindness, according to Dr. Elizabeth Price, Chief of the Com-

munity Health Section of the Department of Health & Welfare.

While syphilis has previously occurred in urban centers, recently cases have been found in small communities and more remote sections of the state.

About half the cases of gonorrhea have been reported in Anchorage but a high incidence has occurred also in Bethel, Nome, Kodiak, and Barrow.

A major attack on gonorrhea is being launched in Anchorage, which has recently contracted with the Federal Government for a \$153,000 impact campaign to try to cut the incidence of venereal disease in the Greater Anchorage Area Borough.

laws? Well, he thinks next time they'll let us know."

Isaac also worries about the hunting season because his people find themselves in competition with white hunters who spot game by plane.

"They stake out the moose, land on the lake and go in. Before any of us get in there, there's everybody there."

There are about 140 people in Tanacross, some work fighting forest fires but little additional cash flow except for welfare checks.

"Those are getting smaller," Isaac notes. "I don't think we're getting along...not for very long."

NOTICE OF PETITION FILING

A petition proposing the incorporation of a first class North Slope Borough has been filed with the Local Affairs Agency by the Arctic Slope Native Association. The petition proposed the following corporate boundaries:

All lands north of the 68th North Latitude from the State's westernmost boundary to 146 West Longitude north along the 146 West Longitude 68°30' North Latitude east to the Canada/United States Border, then north to the limits of the State of Alaska's northern boundary; thence meandering westerly to the point of beginning.

The petition, containing the signatures and resident addresses of 388 persons, additionally requests that:

- (1) In addition to the mandatory first class borough area wide powers of property tax assessment and collection, education and planning, plotting and zoning, the proposed borough be given the authority to exercise, on an areawide (both in and outside cities) basis, all powers available to a first class city under Alaska State law;
- (2) a five-member assembly be elected at large from the proposed borough area;
- (3) Barrow be the borough seat.

Pursuant to Alaska Statutes 07.10.060 and 080, the Local Affairs Agency has reviewed and accepted the petition and is presently conducting an investigation of the borough incorporation proposal. The results of this investigation will be reported to the State Local Boundary Commission, at which time a public hearing will be held.
