On April 14, four bowhead whaling crews had gone out to their sea ice camps off the village of Point Hope. The crews were captained

by Amos Lane, John Oktollik, Billy Weber and Patrick Attungana. Other crews were expected to leave for the ice camps momentarily.

Earlier, on April 10 and 11, every able bodied man took part in breaking trails to the whale camp areas.

This work is done by smoothing out rugged ice hummocks with ice picks so the whalers and dogteams can transport whaling umiaks and supplies to the open water leads. These trails are also used to haul whale meat and muktuk when whalers catch whales.
