The bill has already been passed by the House of Representatives and has been referred to the Foreign Relations Committee in the Senate. That Committee plans an executive session on the legislation.

Senator Gravel has written to Senator J. William Fulbright, chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee to explain to him the possible harm the bill could cause Alaskans

The legislation would set an absolute moratorium on the on the taking of polar bear, without exception of any type.

The Alaska Democrat said such a moratorium would violate the precedent set by the Native Claims Settlement Act and the Ocean Mammal legis-lation which exempted the taking of animals for subsistence purposes by Alaskan Natives.

He also pointed out to Sena tor Fulbright that the State of Alaska has done a fine job of wild-life management, especially in protecting polar bears and in protecting polar bears and that federal legislation was unnecessary to insure that pro-
