

State Welfare Becomes 'Division of Family and Child Services'

The Division of Public Welfare is no more. Commissioner Frederick McGinnis, Department of Health and Welfare, has announced the division name will be changed to Division of Family and Child Services.

Stanley P. Harris, head of the division, reports the name change is consistent with a legislative section which changes the name of the Department of

Health and Welfare to Department of Health and Social Service. This law will be effective August 23.

The new title is more descriptive of the wide range of

Federal Monies Earmarked for Children Programs

WASHINGTON, D.C.—A total of \$293,123 in federal funds has been earmarked for Alaskan programs for children, according to a report by U. S. Senator Ted Stevens.

The U. S. Health Services and Mental Retardation Administration has approved \$135,000 toward construction of a \$677,290 addition to the Alaska Crippled Children and Adult Rehabilitation Center in Anchorage.

Another \$83,123 is earmarked for use by the Fairbanks Headstart Association. The North Star Borough facility will operate for a four month period and serve 80 children.

In addition, \$57,000 has been approved for the Alaska Methodist University Headstart program. Another grant of \$128,500 will finance Rural Alaska Community Action Program's Preschool Training Project. A total of 850 youngsters are involved in this program.


