## **BIA Extends BUI Contract**

The Bureau of Indian Affair has extended a contract with Barrow Utilities for 90 days so terms for another year can be worked out.

A new contract offered last month would not allow for any advance payment to the small utility company and represen-tatives of the plant said they would have to cease operation under these terms.


The 90 day extension staves off shut down of the power, water and sewer treatment plant for a large bureau complex and also shut-off of power to the city of Barrow which would have followed if Barrow Utilities had walked off the job.
