

Will Rogers, Jr. to Keynote at ANB Conference in Ketchikan

Will Rogers, Jr., who this year was appointed special assistant to Robert L. Bennett, Commissioner of Indian Affairs, will be the keynote speaker at the Alaska Native Brotherhood-Sisterhood convention in Ketchikan on November 13.

According to Cy Peck, Grand Secretary of the ANB, Rogers will travel extensively in Alaska after the convention.

His itinerary lists visits to Juneau, Wrangell, Sitka, Anchorage, Fairbanks, Barrow and Kotzebue.

Rogers was singled out by the Secretary of the Interior Stewart Udall for his knowledge of and ability to work with students and teachers in the Bureau of Indian Affairs schools.

His appointment as special assistant to Bennett carries the duty of representing the Department of Interior at meetings such as the one in Ketchikan. He also visits exhibits and festivals.

Rogers is the son of the famous actor-humorist, Will Rogers, Sr., who died near Barrow along with the famous pilot, Wiley Post, in 1935.

Last Russian Governor's Kin Visits Sheldon Jackson Museum

Constantine Dimitri Maxutov, grandson of Prince Dimitri Maksoutoff, last Russian governor to rule over Russian America, paid Sheldon Jackson Museum, Sitka, a visit Tuesday, (October 17).

Accompanied by Mrs. Romaine Hardcastle, who has done considerable re-

search work in connection with the life and history of the former Russian governor, Mr. Maxutov presented the museum with micro film copies of pictures and such personal records and documents as the family was able to bring with them when forced to leave their homeland some forty years ago.

In Sitka for Alaska Day celebration, during the centennial year of the transfer of the territory to the United States, the visit was more than a celebration, for the present New York business man, Mr. Maxutov, because of the part his grandfather played in the transfer, said the visit to Sitka was like "coming Home."

He appeared deeply moved by the manner in which the community has preserved the historical relationship of his grandfather. He first visited the city in 1955.

A graduate of the University of Michigan as a Chemical Engineer in Petroleum Technology, Mr. Maxutov has been affiliated with the California Texas Oil Co. for a number of years. His home is in Pleasantville, New York.

U of A Offers Pilot School
