This project consists of grading and drainage of the Kalifornsky Beach Road from the Sterling Highway Intersection northerly 4.5 miles. The project is located near Kenai, Alaska.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 57 acres of clearing and grubbing; 324,700 cubic yards of unclassified excavation; 17,600 cubic yards of Subbase, grading A; 1,740 linear feet of pipe conduit, 18" to 48" diameter; 204 linear feet of 108" diameter structural plate pipe; and miscellaneous items of work.
