Robert L. Bennett, Commissioner of Indian Affairs, announced today that Wallace E. Galluzzi has been named Superintendent of Haskell Institute, Lawrence, Kansas.

Haskell is a post-high school vocational training school for Indians. Galluzzi was principal at the Institute and has been acting superintendent the past two months since the former superintendent, Thomas Tommaney, became assistant area director for education at Muskogee, Oklahoma.

Galluzzi, a native of Brockway Pa., is a graduate of State Teachers College, Slippery Rock, Pa., and holds a master's degree from Northern State Teachers College, Aberdeen, S.D.

He joined the Bureau of In-

dian Affairs in the Department of the Interior in 1949 as a teacher at Standing Rock Agency, N.D.

He served in positions of increasing responsibility as a teacher and education specialist before being named principal at Haskell in 1963.
