PROPOSAL: The State should direct its royalty energy for in-state, domestic use that provides a stable supply and cost to its citizens.

PROPOSAL: The State should direct its energy wealth to subsidize electrical utilities for costs in excess of some statewide rate or rate structure.

OCTOBER 19

9:30 a.m. PROPOSAL: The State should direct its energy wealth to finance the change of the current energy delivery systems from a reliance on petroleum fuels to alternate energies.

PROPOSAL: The State should encourage energy conservation through education programs, and energy efficient building standard and transportation mode incentives.
