Girl Scouts from the Eielson area delivered 1500 books and about the same number of magazines to the Bureau of Indian Affairs office in Fairbanks—the results of their 1971 Native Villages Book Drive.

Brownie, junior and cadette troops from Eielson AFB and its vicinity collected books for the drive. It was coordinated with Mrs. Sweetsir of the BIA Education Office.

This office will transport and distribute the books, divided as to adult and children's, to Barrow and other remote villages who have indicated a need for reading materials.

Mrs. Nicholas Masters chaired the book drive and supervised transport of the books to Fairbanks via Air Force truck and "a couple of willing husbands" who loaded and unloaded the dozens of cartons.

Single bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials, and equipment, and performing all work on Project R-044-1(2), Tudor Road-Muldoon Road, described herein, will be received until 2:00 p.m., prevailing time, March 11, 1971 in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project will consist of grading, drainage, hot bituminous surfacing, and highway illumination on 1.3 miles of roadway located within the City limits of Anchorage, Alaska.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 90,000 cubic yards of Common Excavation; 105,000 cubic yards of Muck Excavation; 374,000 tons of Borrow; 5,300 cubic yards of Crushed Aggregate base; 7,800 cubic yards of Subbase, Grading "B"; 3,200 tons of Hot Bituminous Surfacing; 182 tons of 120-150 Asphalt Cement and 39 tons of MC-30 Prime Coat; 400,000 square feet of Hydro-seeding; 500 linear feet of 8-inch Cast Iron Water Conduit; Highway Lighting System, lump sum, all required; and miscellaneous items of work.

All work shall be completed in 275 Calendar Days.
