Governor Jay **Tammond** recently announced a significant breakthrough in local hire for Alaska residents on the trans-Alaska pipeline.
Ilammond said, "The General Counsel of the National Labor

Relations Board (NLRB) has made a formal determination that Alaskan residents where they are qualified and available are entitled to preference in dispatching to pipeline dispatching employment. pipeline

This is an extremely significant decision for all Alaskans. It means the procedure established earlier this year by the state

wherin qualified Alaskan residents are dispatched ahead of Alaskan non-residents, regardless of their position on the hiring list, has been upheld and formally been upheld and formally accepted by the General Counsel of the NLRB.

The ruling made it clear the NLRB will not issue complaints against. Alaska local unions making preferential dispatches of Alaska resident to jobs on the trans-Alaska pipeline
