ing recipients of Bureau of private institutions, as long Indian Affairs grants to attend sectarian colleges and vocational schools has been introduced by Senators Ernest Gruening and Bob Bartlett.

The bill, S. 876, would repeal that part of the Act of March 2, 1917, which prohibits appropriated funds Congress from being used for the education of Indian (including Eskimo and Aleut) children in sectarian schools.

He felt that the present law placed Indians at a serious disadvantage in preparing themselves for their chosen careers.
