

Land Use Group Invites 15 Alaskans

The federal-state Land Use Planning Commission has invited 15 prominent Alaskans to serve on an advisory committee to the commission.

Nominations for the Committee members were sought from the public.

Section 17(a) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act calls upon the Commission to establish a committee of land-use advisors composed of "representatives of commercial land users in Alaska, recreational land users, wilderness users, environmental groups, Alaska Natives, and other citizens."

The Co-Chairmen stated on behalf of the Commission, "We are delighted to invite such prominent Alaskans to contribute their knowledge and experience to the Commission in its land-use planning responsibilities. We look forward to meeting with the Advisory Committee at the next formal meeting of the Land Use Planning Commission November 15, 1972."
