Sen. Gravel Writes Nixon Concerning Fishing Violations

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Senator Mike Gravel has written to President Nixon asking him to discuss Japanese violations of Alaska's fishing waters with Japanese Prime Minister Kakuei Tanaka during the meeting the two have scheduled for the end of this month.

The Alaska Democrat wrote to the President endorsing an appeal for such a discussion sent to the White House by John Shively, the Executive Director of the Rural Alaska Community Action Program.

Senator Gravel told the President that the matter of Japanese intrusions into Alaskan fishing waters should be a "major order of business" in his meeting with the Prime Minister. "In many areas of Alaska," Senator Gravel noted, "this has been a disastrous fishing season. While such flagrant violations have been extremely annoying in the past, this year, on top of the frustration of the empty nets of the fishermen, they are intolerable."

Senator Gravel also noted that there is "now incontrovertible evidence that Japanese seamen are taking our sea mammals with in a few miles of our shores."

He referred to recent aerial photographs of such activity. The Senator asserted that the Japanese have little regard for the effort by Alaskans to conserve the sea mammal herds.

Senator Gravel told the President that the intrusions by the Japanese into Alaskan waters are in violation of international treaties. He said previously that little is done by the United States Government to enforce these treaties and to discipline those who violate them.

In a letter from Philip J. Davis, Acting Director, U. S. Department of Labor, Employment Standards Administration, Office of Federal Contract Compliance, the Alaska Plan Policy Board was assured that all federal agencies have already been notified of their requirement to satisfy guidelines as set forth in the Alaska Plan.
