Fabrication and enclosure of buildings continues to be the major construction effort at the terminal and station sites.

Outside building construction includes forming, concrete pours, steel erection and paneling installation. Indoor work includes heat piping, permanent lighting, above work includes neat piping, permanent lighting, above ground electrical, partition and cable tray installation.

At the terminal, ank construction has begun in the West Tank Farm, with form

storage tank in progress.
In the East Tank Farm, where the majority of tank erection was completed during 1975, containment walls are being erected, sewers are under construction and electrical conduit is being installed.

At the terminal's Berth 4, the first triple joint of 48-inch-diameter crude oil pipe has been completed.

Among construction activities continuing at the terminal are access road construction, rebar placement and concrete pours.

Manpower currently stands at about 1,500 employed at the pump stations, about 2,500 employed at the terminal and fewer than 3,000 on the pipeline portion of the project.
