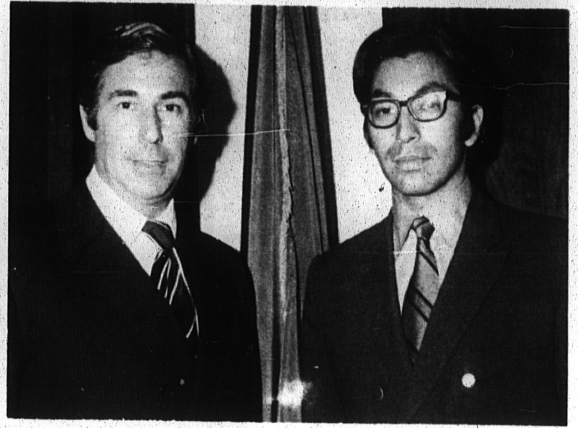


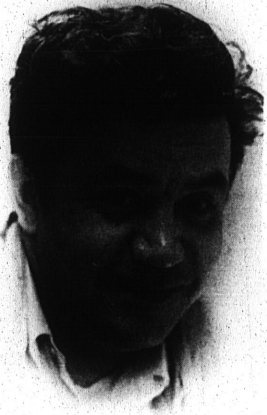
# SOME OF THE IMPORTANT CLAIMS WORKERS



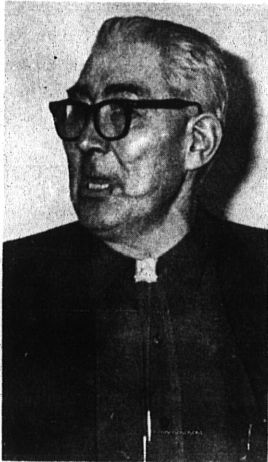
**HOUSE LEADER**—Congressman Wayne Aspinall (D-Colorado) visited Alaska two years ago, spoke for native land claims in the House debate.

**TANANA CHIEF**—Al Ketzler, president of the Tanana Chiefs.



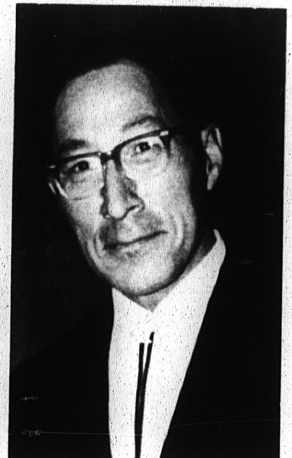
**RISING TO SPEAK**—Frank Degan of Unakleet, chastizing the AFN board to ask for more land.



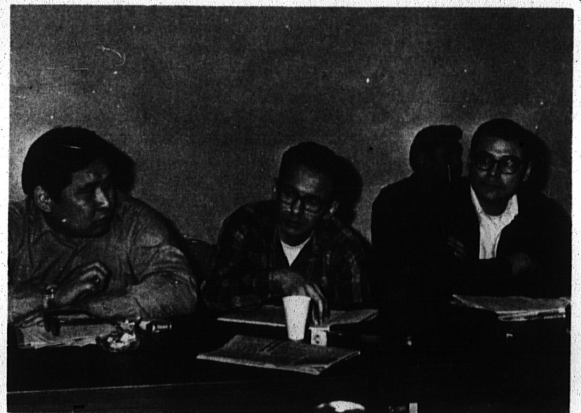
**JOHN BORBRIDGE**—Tlingit Haida Central Council President.
