BIA \$69,800 Fund Support for AVEC

Village Electric Cooperative is due to receive a significant boost to its program from the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

BIA Area Director, Charles announc ed A. Richmond. Monday that the Bureau has funded, beginning next July 1, a special \$69,800 package to be used in purchasing wiring materials, for technical help with installation, and to help support the families of village electric operators during a 6-months training in Anchorage. period

Bureau is one of several contributing agencies in the AVEC program.

Under the AVEC plan, 67 villages to receive electricity by 1970. Ten villages were tentatively selected last week for initial in stall ation.

On June 1, two trainees from each of these villages will arrive in Anchorage to begin a 6-months course in the operation of the electrical trainees' systems. The families will accompany them to Anchorage for the duration of the training.

Affairs funds will be used to purchase wiring materials, and to provide technical assistance with installation. The funds will come from the Bureau's Housing Improvement Program. Technical aspects will be handled through the BIA Branch of Plant Management.

The Bureau's policy is to help those families who can find no other means of paying for the electrical services installation.

Every effort will be made first to see that as many villagers as possible pay their own way, or are helped to find financial arrangements for installation costs.

The Bureau will provide support where other funds are not available, but their primary role will be to provide technical assistance for installation. They look to the individual villagers themselves to help as they can with the initial wiring.

\$37,800 remaining will be used by the BI A Employment Assistance to help support trainee families in Anchorage.

The Area Director, Mr. Richmond, said that the Bureau is prepared to assist the sponsoring agencies by linking funds and services in transportation, providing housing and counseling services as needed.


